In continuation of the Board's efforts to align school education with the transformative vision of the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020** and the **National Curriculum Framework for School Education (NCFSE) 2023**, the theme for the *CENBOSEC* January–June 2025 edition is:

"Multilingualism for an Inclusive India."

This edition aims to explore how languages, especially **Matri Bhasha** (mother tongue), contribute to the holistic development of learners and promote inclusivity in classrooms and beyond. Suggested Activities: (In Hindi or English)

<u>Activity A: Entries invited from Educators:</u> Principals and teachers are invited to send their 'original articles' in **Hindi or English** on any of the sub-themes given above for the forth-coming issue of CENBOSEC, using the Google form link https://forms.gle/T978CU6ZP8dduizT9. A committee of experts will select the best articles for publication in this issue and the best 20 articles will be published. The decision of the committee will be final.

Schools may choose to explore <u>Any One</u> of the following sub-themes and <u>Any One</u> suggestive activity based on the sub-theme chosen to submit their entries.

1. Matri Bhasha: The Foundation of Learning

- Lesson plans or activity ideas promoting mother tongue integration
- Reflective articles on using mother tongue in early childhood education





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2. Languages: Windows to Culture and Identity

- Documentation of festivals/heritage projects conducted in schools
- Articles on linking language teaching with cultural activities

3. Technology Tools for Language Learning

- Success stories from implementing blended learning for language teaching
- Reports on innovative use of edtech tools (e.g., language apps, digital storytelling)

4. Multilingual Minds, Global Citizens

- Descriptive write-ups of multilingual school environments
- Reports on international collaborations or exchange programs

You are requested to disseminate the above information among all the stakeholders and encourage them to ensure their maximum participation in submitting the articles and cover designs.



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Annexure 1

Guidelines

The guidelines for the schools participating in the creation and submission of articles are as below.

- Topic Selection: Authors must choose one of the sub-themes listed in the circular. These are
 designed to explore various aspects of promoting multilingualism practices in schools. The
 authors are encouraged to write creatively, offering real examples from their schools with
 actionable insights.
- Suggested Structure of Article:
 - Title: Choose a clear and concise title for the article.
 - **Introduction:** Provide an overview of the topic and explain its importance.
 - Main Content: Discuss innovative practices, school initiatives, and personal experiences related to the theme.
 - Conclusion: Summarise key points and suggest future actions or strategies to promote multilingualism in schools.
 - Reflection/ best practices for sharing with others,
 - o End notes/ References.

Submission Guidelines:

- o Articles can be written in **English** or **Hindi**.
- The author should insert a coloured passport size self-photograph at the end of the article and mention her/his name, class/designation, school name and address with school affiliation number.
- The author shall submit the article in MS-Word only (PDF will not be considered). The word file should be named "Name of author_School affiliation number".
- The article sent for submission must be previously unpublished.
- o Articles should be well-written with clarity and copy-edited carefully before submission.
- The articles must be checked for plagiarism. Plagiarism is seen as a serious professional misconduct and, if identified, the submitted article will be summarily rejected.
- The length of articles should not exceed 1000 words/ 2 pages (A4 size) including images. Font size should be 11-point Arial, whether in normal, bold or italic; including endnotes with line spacing of 1.5.
- Please do not insert line breaks in the text or special spacing for formatting. All texts / paragraphs should have one and a half spacing.
- o In case of articles in Hindi, the font should be Mangal with font size 11.
- Tables and images should be placed close to the text where they are referred. Table headings should be above the tables. The image caption should be centred below the image.
- Scanned images of articles will be rejected.
- The article should mention the sub-theme as well as a proper title.
- Relevant pictures uploaded should be of 300 pixels.
- Cover page design should be in Portrait Orientation, Self-composed (hand-made) by the student and should be Al and plag free. Landscape orientation will not be considered.

All citations should be in endnotes and not in the text. It is the responsibility of the author to obtain permission for the use of any copyrighted material, including images.
