Dear Principal.

Project Veer Gatha was instituted in 2021 with the aim to disseminate the details of acts of bravery of the Gallantry Awardees and the life stories of these brave hearts among the students so as to raise the spirit of patriotism and instil amongst them values of civic consciousness. As part of this, the students framed different projects through various media like art, poems, essays and multimedia on these gallantry award winners and best projects were awarded at national level by Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Education, Govt. of India.

The Ministry of Defence (MoD) in collaboration with Ministry of Education (MoE) has now decided to launch Project Veer Gatha 5.0 during 2025-26, as per following details:

- 1. Virtual/ face-to-face awareness programmes/ sessions: Ministry of Defence will organize virtual/ face-to-face awareness programmes/ sessions for schools across the country. List of venues and timing for the aforesaid programme / sessions will be shared shortly.
- 2. Activities: Interdisciplinary and art-integrated activities like Poem, Paragraph, Essay, Painting, Drawing, Multi-Media Presentation, Short-video (Anchoring/ Storytelling/ reporting) etc. would be the activities to be done by individual students as a Project.
- 3. The categories, Activities and suggestive topics are as follows:

#### 4. Timelines:

11.09.2025 to 30.09.2025	Organizing virtual / face to face interactions of gallantry award winners with schools.  Conduct of Activities at the School Level. Schools shall themselves conduct the activities on the above topics and evaluate the same.
01.10.2025 to 15.10.2025	After the conduct of activities at the school level, the school shall upload 01 best entry per category i.e., a total of 04 entries from each school, at the MyGov portal.
	Category-1: Preparatory Stage (Grade 3 <sup>rd</sup> to 5 <sup>th</sup> ): 01 best entry Category-2: Middle Stage (Grade 6 <sup>th</sup> to 8 <sup>th</sup> ): 01 best entry Category-3: Secondary Stage (Grade 9 <sup>th</sup> to 12 <sup>th</sup> ): 01 best entry for Grade 9 <sup>th</sup> to 10 <sup>th</sup> and 01 best entry for Grade 11 <sup>th</sup> to 12 <sup>th</sup>
	NOTE: Schools with highest grade upto grade 5, 8 and 10 can also submit total 4 entries. The breakup is as under:
	(i). Schools upto grade 10: School will submit 01 best entry in each of the Category-1, 2 & 3. School can also submit an extra entry in any one of category. Total entries to be submitted by school is 04.
	(ii). Schools upto grade 8: School will submit 01 best entry in Category-1 & 2. School can submit two extra best entries from any Category. Total entries to be submitted by school is 04.
	(iii). Schools upto grade 5: Since there is only one Category for School upto grade 5, the school will submit 04 best entries in Category-1.

(Note: The schools should not wait for the last date of submission. As soon as the activities are completed at the school level and 01 best entry in each category is shortlisted by schools, they shall submit the same at the given portal).

- 5. Portal for Submission of Entries: There will be common MyGov Portal to upload all the entries by the schools. The CBSE affiliated schools located abroad will also upload the entries online after evaluation at their own school level.
- **6. Winners**: There will be winners at every level. The number of winners to be declared is as follows:
  - a. **National Level:** 100 winners (Super 100). No Veer Gatha winner (at national level) of earlier versions will be included in 100 winners (at national level) of Veer Gatha 5.0.
    - i. Category 1: Preparatory Stage (Grade 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup>) = 25 winners
    - ii. Category 2: Middle Stage (Grade 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>) = 25 winners
    - iii. Category 3: Secondary Stage (Grade 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>) = 50 winners (25 winners from grades 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> and 25 winners from grades 11<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>)
  - b. **State / UT Level**: 08 Winners (two from each category). 2 winners each from category 1 & 2, and 4 winners from category 3 which includes 2 winners from grade 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> and 2 winners from grades 11<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> at State / UT level irrespective of Board (Will **not** include students selected in Super 100)
  - c. **District Level**: 04 winners (one from each category). 1 winner from each category 1 & 2, and 2 winners from category 3 which includes 1 winner from grade 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> extra and 1 winner from 11<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>. These will **not** include students earlier selected in Super 100 and the students selected at State/ UT level.

- 7. Felicitation of Winners: The winners at national level will be felicitated jointly by Ministry of Education, Govt. of India & Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India. Each winner will be awarded a cash prize of Rs.10,000/- by the Ministry of Defence. All the winners at District and State /UT will be felicitated by respective District, State/ UT. The modalities of the prize to be given in State/ UT and District level will be decided by State/ UT and District Authorities. A certificate will be given to all the winners as follows:
  - a. To Students Selected in Super 100 jointly by Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Education, Government of India.
  - b. To Students Selected at State/ UT level by Principal Secretary/ Secretary Education of the concerned State/ UT
  - c. To Students Selected at District level jointly by Collector/ District Magistrate/ Deputy Commissioner and District Education Officer/ appropriate higher official as decided by the Education Department of the concerned State/ UT/ District.
