Subject: Celebration of Janjatiya Gaurav Divas 2025 - reg.

As you are aware, 15th November, the birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda is celebrated as *Janjatiya Gaurav Divas* to honour all the tribal freedom fighters and for remembering and acknowledging their contribution to the freedom struggle and cultural heritage. The coming 15th November is the 150th birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda.

The period from 1st November – 15th November, 2025 will be commemorated as Janjatiya Gaurav Pakhwara in all CBSE schools. To celebrate the Janjatiya Gaurav Divas (JJGD) 2025 and the contribution of tribal communities to Indian society and heritage in general, the schools may organise the suggestive activities from 1st November – 15th November, 2025 enclosed at **Annexure-1** and may further customize these activities so as to cover the following broad themes:

- Health and Wellness

To commemorate "Janjatiya Gaurav Pakhwara" from 1st November to 15th November, 2025, here is a suggestive day-wise plan for students. Each activity aims to foster awareness, respect, and understanding of Janjatiya culture, focusing on the contributions of Birsa Munda and the heritage of tribal communities.

SI.No.	Date & Day	Theme	Activity
1.	Day 1- 01st November 2025 (Saturday) (Inaugural Day)	Commencement of Janjatiya Gaurav Pakhwara	 Commencement of Janjatiya Gaurav Pakhwara will be declared in school morning assembly. Show a documentary or presentation on Janjatiya culture and history, focusing on diverse tribal traditions, lifestyles, and contributions to Indian society.
2.	Day 2- 03 rd November 2025 (Monday)	Tribal Wall Art Project	 Students may create tribal art on school walls or designated areas. Teachers can provide guidance on various styles like 'Warli' or 'Gond' are, promoting awareness of tribal artistic heritage.
3.	Day 3- 04th November 2025 (Tuesday)	Conduct of Competitions-Dance Drama, Storytelling, Model making etc.	 Organization of competition among students focusing on triba music, storytelling, drama, mode making etc.
4.	Day 4- 06th November 2025 (Thursday)	Seminar on Janjatiya Contributions	 Invite local historians or tribal community leaders to speak with students about Janjatiya culture, history, and contributions. Q&A sessions/Quiz with student can be held to foster curiosity and understanding.
5.	Day 5- 07th November 2025 (Friday)	Classroom Discussion and Essay writing	 Teachers conduct classroom discussions on topics related to local tribal communities' heritage, focusing on food, cultural diversity, values, and traditions. Students may be encouraged to participate in Essay Writing.
6.	Day 6 – 10th November 2025 (Monday)	Drama/Nukkad-Natak	 Conduct Drama/Nukkad-Natak on the life story of any famous tribal achiever. Session conducted by Local Tribal achievers to share their success story with students.

7.	Day 7- 11th November 2025 (Tuesday)	Visit to Janjatiya Museum (where possible)	Activity: Arrange field trips to local Janjatiya museums for students to experience tribal history, artifacts, and culture first hand. Schools can conduct virtual museum tours if physical visits are not feasible.
8.	Day 8- 12th November 2025 (Wednesday)	Cultural Performances of Tribal Dances and Songs	Students may perform tribal dances and songs. Invite community members to guide students in practicing traditional performances.
9.	Day 9- 13th November 2025 (Thursday)	Community Bhoj	 Organise a Community Bhoj with at least one tribal recipe in the menu.
10.	Day 10- 14th November 2025 (Friday)	Outreach Program: Visit to Tribal Homes	Arrange small-group visits for students to Janjatiya community homes, giving them direct exposure to tribal life and traditions. Emphasize respect and learning from tribal hosts.
11.	Day 11- 15th November 2025 (Saturday) (Closing Day)	Reflection and Presentation Day	 Organisation of special assembly for floral tribute to Birsa Munda followed by playing of documentary film prepared by NCERT. Share his life story, contributions to the freedom struggle, and his role in promoting tribal rights. Students prepare presentations on what they learned during Janjatiya Gaurav Pakhwara. Students share key takeaways, showcasing projects, artwork, and reflections on the week's activities. Later they can be appreciated on their performance.

Each day's activities help students develop a deep appreciation for Janjatiya heritage while promoting cultural diversity and inclusivity in schools.
