The technology have made the work of looking after the elderly people by improving their physical health and even their medical health.</p> <p>Some of the technologies are:</p> <p>Social connection: Internet based audio / video applications, email, whatsapp, skype and social media platforms are enabling senior citizens' social interactions, when physically visiting friends and family members isn't possible frequently.</p> <p>Safety: Elderly people who live alone, feel safer having a personal device which enables them to call for help with the simple push of a button. Both the elderly and their family members can have peace of mind, knowing that the device facilitates a call for help in any emergency situation. Safety is also a concern for those seniors who are suffering from Alzheimer's disease. GPS tracking devices are available today that can monitor the location of seniors and send alerts to guardians or children.
