Geospatial technology is an umbrella phrase associated with a range of various technologies which include remote sensing, Global Positioning System (GPS), Geographic Information System (GIS), information technologies, and field sensors, that are intended to facilitate the process of capturing/storing/ processing/ displaying/ disseminating information tied to a location.

This present course curriculum offers an opportunity for the students to understand the basics of geospatial technology for developing an interest in the principles, practical uses, and resources related to geospatial technologies. PRACTICAL GUIDELINES FOR CLASS XI

Question to be more of General nature, project work or the curriculum. Investigatory Project especially those that show considerable amount of effort and originality, on the part of the student, should get suitable high marks, while project of a routine or stereotyped nature should only receive MEDIOCRE marks.

Procedure for Record of Marks in the Practical answer-books:

The examiner will indicate separately marks of practical examination on the title page of the answer-books under the following heads:-

Project -10 marks

Projects for the final practical is given below .Student may be assigned

Viva based on Project -05 marks

The teacher conducting the final practical examination may ask verbal questions related to the project, if any, done by the student. Alternatively, if no project has been assigned to the students, viva may be based on questions of practical nature from the field of subject as per the Curriculum

Practical File -10 Marks

Students to make a power point presentation / assignment / practical file / report. Instructor shall assign them any outlet to study the elements in retailing.

Suggested list of Practical –

- 1. Study any one of the toposheets (educational series) and prepare a detail report on it covering all the important natural and man-made features, type of land use, nature of terrain and economic activities.
- 2. Collect all the coordinates and altitude values of all the four corners of your school building with the help of a GPS receiver or a smartphone (eg. Use compass feature in iphone). Check these values and mention the variation if any, in google or Bhuvan satellite maps. Write the complete steps and procedure in your file.
- 3. Study the weather charts prepared by Indian Meteorological deptt of India. You can use the IMD website also if hard copy is not available. Prepare a weather report of that day after studying all the essential weather elements.

- 4. Prepare a route map from school to home or vice-versa. You can do this vectorization on Google, NASA's world wind or ISRO's Bhuvan. Measure the accurate distance, mark it and take the image. Explain all the steps with the image in your file.
- 5. Prepare a detailed colored diagram of electromagnetic spectrum and mention the important bands for remote sensing process. Explain the difference between Panchromatic and RGB bands.
- 6. Download any GIS application in your mobile or desktop and measure the area of any five buildings including your home and school. Explain the step by step process in your file and tally the figure with the actual data.
- 7. Open Rolta Geomatica Focus or the trial version of any GIS software like QGIS or ARC GIS and explain its tool bar. What all functions can be done by each symbol of toolbar. Prepare a table in your file.
- 8. Download different satellite images from authentic sources like UGSS. Categorize and paste them in your file according to high, medium and low resolution. Explain the difference in these images.
- 9. Explain the difference between a Panchromatic and Multispectral image. Download the examples for both and paste them in your file with explanation.
- 10. Differentiate between Geostationary and Sun-synchronous satellites in detail with examples, diagrams and images.

Students to make a PowerPoint presentation. Alternatively, if they can't be assigned a power point presentation then they can communicate their project work through practical file.

Suggested list of Projects -

- Download a multispectral satellite image and open it in GIS software. Now open the RGB
 mapper of the image. Convert the image into Panchromatic or change it into false color
 image. Observe it carefully and explain the steps in your file.
- 2. Find out the function of GPS in vehicle location. Find out the various apps available in market like Autocop app and explain the procedure. Provide the sample data and maps prepare about the location and movement of that vehicle by the app.
- 3. Explain the process of triangulation and trilateration with the help of suitable diagrams and timeline. How does this process help in finding accurate location, and velocity of an object?

- 4. Download a Panchromatic and a Multispectral image and open these in your GIS software. Now view the histograms of these images. Find out the radiometric resolution or scale of the images explain the differences in these histograms. Shoe the single histogram of a Panchromatic image and three histograms of the Multispectral image.
- 5. Prepare a list of Indian satellites and classify them according to their usage. Explain how IRS series is different from INSAT series of satellites. Give details with examples, diagrams or images.
- 6. Explain the Buffer analysis tool. Create a buffer of flooding in a toposheet or in NCERT Bhuvan website. Mention all the steps in your file and explain its importance in Hazard mapping.
- 7. Choose a case study of application of Geospatial technology in the field of Agriculture and natural vegetation. Explain how NDVI is used in this practice.
- 8. Explain how Geospatial technology is useful in mapping the pandemic of Covid-19 in the world. Explain the disease management and control in detail with the help of GIS.
- 9. Choose any latest natural or man-made disaster like Australian bush fires and the role of Geospatial technology in its preparedness, mitigation, impact analysis and providing aid and rescue.
- 10. Mobile and digital gaming is extremely popular among children and youth. These games are widely dependent on social media and Geospatial technology. Choose any game like Pokemon Go and explain in detail how Geospatial technology is used in this gaming.
