	French knot. Outlines of animals			
	and birds can be made more			
	delicate by using only one strand of			
	the thread. The method to			
	embroider the French knot and the			
	bullion stitch is almost the same.			
	Thus, sometimes they can be used			
	to substitute each other. French			
	knots are used in garments like			
	bibs, frocks, skirts, etc. It is also
